Physical Development:



I don't have a pet, but we do keep hens in the back garden so we can have fresh eggs every day. I like looking for crabs in the rock pools. I like playing football too with Jack and Duncan. On Sunday we go to church with my Nana. I like red and my favourite food is jam on toast.

Use the template at the bottom to write your own profile. You could write about how old you are; what food you like to eat; what activities you like to do; who is in your family and things you like to do together etc. Write about anything you think makes you special and **unique**. You could add a photograph or picture of yourself too.

When you have finished. Compare yourself with Raj or/and Carlee. Is there anything that is the same about you? What things are different.

You could listen to the online story of 'Brenda's Boring Egg', which helps us think about similarities and differences and how each one of us is special.

Thank you so much for helping usor you can think of your own.



Just for fun: put on some really up-beat music and make up your own dance. You could even make your own video.




All About Me
